Also, laying the groundwork for a Summer Experience for Connect members transitioning to AZA is vital to cementing their role as a part of our international movement.

CREATE VALUABLE RESOURCES: Rather than creating esoteric resources solely for the Morim of the Order, releases and materials will be available to every Aleph in the Order. These resources will contain pertinent information and techniques that can be used in strengthening chapters and regions, for example: AZA history and traditions, ways to attract new members through the appeal of Judaism, how to engage parents, and more.

INVIGORATE CLTC: The process of coordinating a CLTC will include more in-depth trainings than in years past on how to best lead productive sessions with attendees. The CLTC staff and coordinators, beginning this summer, will work to create tangible goals with each attendee. Through successful follow-up with each attendee on these goals, we can maintain the maximum number of Alephs continuing their dedication to AZA.

DISPEL THE DICHOTOMY BETWEEN TRADITIONS AND PROGRESS: The Order's history and traditions are important tools that we can use to learn from; we can derive successful strategies from tales of Alephs past.
