A Three Step Plan for the 87th Year: Focusing on our Foundation to Strengthen our Future



Step 1 of the 3 step plan is to properly educate the current members of AZA creating a bright and stable future for our movement using:
CLTC

- ✂ Make CLTC relevant for the participants and give information they will actually use in their chapters.
- ✂ Ensure that the right people attend CLTC by creating materials to help regions target individuals and to help Alephs determine if it's right for them.
- ✂ Make CLTC the middle of the experience: send resources both before and after CLTC to strengthen the program.

Chapter and Regional Education

- ✂ Create accessible AIT resources on the internet for board members and non board members.
- ✂ Create resources to help chapters determine which resources should constitute a customized curriculum for their members.
- ✂ Create a relevant member's manual: keep the historical value of the Blue Book and also turn it into a true member's manual.
- ✂ Establish resources for personal AZA education: online course of AZA history for Aleph who cannot go to CLTC because of time or money issues.

Once we have properly educated our current members, step 2 is to expand and recruit new members through:

Teen Connection

- ✂ Develop teen led and teen programmed Teen Connection programs across the Order.
- ✂ Establish Teen Connection leadership positions in each Region with a Task Force helping to plan, lead and recruit for events.
- ✂ Create a system where Teen Connectors "Graduate" from Teen Connection and then become members of AZA and BBG Chapters.

Regional and Chapter Recruitment

- ✂ Continue the Membership Ladder so every Chapter, Region and Council will recruit new members year round.
- ✂ Teach Chapters and Regions recruiting methods and sharpen the skill of new member recruitment.
- ✂ Establish Methods and Resources teaching each member how to recruit, so the task does not solely depend on board members.

Step 3 in the plan is to retain our older members. We need to ensure that members do not leave BBYO before their time.

- ✂ Plan senior night events giving older members a way to still have fun in their region.
- ✂ Create Regional and Chapter leadership positions whose duty is to find ways to keep older members involved in Regional and Chapter affairs.
- ✂ Create active and always-developing incentives to retain members. Enhance the BBYO experience for the older members to keep them coming back.
- ✂ Institute big brother-little brother programs so older members can still be invested in the success of the younger members.
- ✂ Remember that BBYO is fun, board positions and initiatives will only be productive if the members are enjoying what they are doing.
