- Membership -

Recruitment & Retention

Talk with each Region's Godol and Moreh to outline a plan for successful membership growth depending on region size, type, and atmosphere.

Promote the "1 to 1" system, which encourages regions and chapters to ask each member to name one Jewish teen who is currently not involved in AZA. If every current member recruited one person, membership numbers would double.

Write releases that detail ways to recruit members, what kind of prospective programs to plan, how to communicate to new members, and how to strengthen membership as a whole.

Promote effective ways of communication with prospective members and parents.

Create an International Membership Committee to work specifically on recruitment techniques and srategie.

Write releases that detail ways to keep members involved & engaged and how to utilize members who are not as active.

"5 member/per month/per region" plan; every region recruits 5 members every month for 9 months = approx. 2,000 members

Teen Connections

Educate council/regions about Teen Connection, and how successful TC programs will ensure strong & successful membership intake in January and beyond.

Introduces the idea of BBYO & leadership to TC members early so that by the time they join AZA, they are more comfortable. Create releases designed specifically for Morim or TC chairmen to teach them how to plan successful TC programs.

Talk with counterparts to set realistic TC goals and create a "game plan" aimed to achieve those goals.

- CLTC -

Select coordinators who are qualified and who deserve the immense honor.

Begin CLTC promotion early & ensure Morim and Godolim know when registration opens and how to successfully promote summer programs through the region/chapter.

Be a friend, mentor, and brother to every participant

Get in contact with participants I month ahead of time to answer a questionnaire that can be used later.

Retool CLTC curriculum to teach chapter leaders how to plan out-of-the-box programs, recruit members in new ways, and be stronger leaders.

Inspire & empower CLTC attendees by challenging them to take action and step up through a meaningful Separates.

Retool "CLTC Follow-up" to make it interactive, and ask CLTC alumni what could have been done better.

Work hand in hand with the 18th International Aym-Ha Chaverot to make CLTC 2010 meaningful and powerful.

Send out a monthly "Beber Press" to detail important news and tips for successful recruitment, retention, and education.

Keep up the Moreh Blog on b-linked and encourage counterparts to ask questions through the "Ask the Grand Aleph Moreh" page.

Keep in contact with Morim weekly through phone calls, email, and Facebook.

Divide Regional Morim into groups to call different counterparts each day.

Encourage Morim to talk with each other, especially those who have similar regions and similar issues.

Encourage Regional Morim to write their own releases and post them up on b-linked.

Ensure Chapter Morim receive all releases and are being passed on valuable information.

Talk with Regional Morim about Chapter Morim who need an extra push and call them myself.

- Education -

Why?

Education is the foundation of our organization; without it, traditions, memories, brotherhood, and leadership would not be passed down to future generations.

Education can help bring membership up (see below for how).

Education can bring the quality & creativity of programming up (see below for how).

Education shouldn't just be one of the Five Folds; it should be a continuous process in which older members teach younger members the ways of the chapter/region, how to plan programs, how to recruit members, and why summer programs are so great. Education ensures that our Order's foundations are maintained and strengthened

Education ensures further progress in all we do; most importantly in regard to future leadership in our Order

How?

Membership: with more educated Alephs recruitment goes from a 1-2 man army, to an entire chapter making phone calls, planning programs, and turning prospectives into members.

Programming: with more educated Alephs, they know how to more successfully plan programs, what the Five Folds are, and how important it is to plan exciting, creative, and engaging programs in regions/chapters.

Write releases detailing the importance of education, how to do it successfully & in a fun way, some education ideas, and more. Talk with counterparts to create "game plans" aimed to increase education in each region.

Have regions create individual curriculums; post curriculums on b-linked along with other helpful resources to improve education.
