

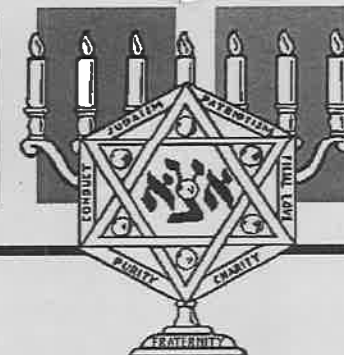

# Goals & Ideas

If elected  
I would...

Launch...

...an IC planning blog that I would update regularly throughout the IC planning process. The blog would include any meeting minutes, major decisions and information pertaining to what will no doubt be our Movement's largest gathering. The blog will also allow for member feedback on all decisions allowing everyone to have a voice in the planning process and ensuring an optimal experience for all.

Incorporate...

...a college fair into IC 2013. A college fair at our Order's largest gathering would allow students to acquire information about many different schools and allow schools to recruit members of BBYO. This would also serve as a great time for colleges to witness first hand what our organization is capable of achieving and why our members stand out in the college application process.

Establish...

...a new branch of programming centered around the Friends and Alumni Network (FAN). Over the last several years, FAN has become a developed and well known part of our Organization but the one aspect it lacks is strong programming across the Order. I believe FAN would benefit immensely from strong, youth led programming for the adults that are so important to the success of BBYO.

Create...

...a way for regions and councils to, on a volunteer basis, open their programs and conventions to small delegations of members outside of their usual boundaries. This would allow more opportunity for long-distance BBYO friends to come together through official BBYO programming. No regions/councils would be required to open any of their programs/conventions but, if they wanted to, it would give them the option of deciding how large of a delegation they would accept, either through application or through a first-come-first-serve basis.

Work...

...with the 88th Mazkir and BBYO staff to publicize IC 2013 outside of the Jewish community in order to show the world what an amazing Organization BBYO is. Since IC is a time when our Movement puts its best foot forward, I believe it is an optimal opportunity for us to promote BBYO to any media or press willing to listen. Media attention would create a name for BBYO outside the Jewish community and secure our spot in the world as a well-known and powerful Movement, allowing us the opportunity to have a greater impact on a larger scale.

Provide...

...more opportunities to make new international BBYO friends outside of structured international programming. BBYO exists in almost every major city in the U.S. and in several countries around the world, so why not turn family vacations into an opportunity to meet new people in BBYO? Currently, making connections with BBYO-ers in other cities requires a personal connection. I want to build a website that creates a means of contacting BBYO members interested in meeting Alephs or BBGs visiting their cities. This would give visitors the comfort and ease of friendship that any international BBYO program offers.

## Other Goals

■■■■ Establish a mutually beneficial relationship through monthly calls and weekly emails with all of my counterparts in which I am not a condescending, superior officer but a friend who is there to both give and take advice on anything related to programming.

■■■■ Start Program Bank competitions that give great programmers incentive to share their ideas with others.

■■■■ Work with my BBG counterpart to select only the highest quality applicants for programming chairs while still finding opportunity for those who do not receive chair positions to be involved in International programming.

■■■■ Emphasize the importance of the Degrees of Programming and Five Folds as programming tools to all S'ganim.
