

- Celebrate AZA Shabbat with a Regional Judaio Program
- Work with the Regional Aleph S'gan to incorporate Judaism into all regional programs
- Inform the region of all upcoming Jewish holidays

Bittker and Out-of-Area Chapters:

- Use the Bittker Center more resourcefully, having more events there than ever before
- Have a senior retreat at the Bittker Center
- Encourage chapters to function more often with our out-of-town chapters, Tikvah and Echad
- Work with the out-of-town chapters to increase their attendance at regional events, concleves, and conventions
- Visit both out-of-town chapters and work with the Regional Aleph Moreh to insure both oters have a successful year

- Heavily promote Stand Up! throughout the course of the year, including at FC, RC, YLC, and ETC

Community Service and Social Action:

- Set a a goal of over 1,500 hours of community service for AZA
- Encourage chapters to have a community service function at least every six weeks
- Donate at least \$250 to the BBYO Emergency Fund
- Plan at least two FUN Regional Community Service programs
 The Downtown Synagogue, JARC, Meer Assisted Living,
 Kadima, Children's Hospital, Grace Centers of Hope
 - Help plan the 2011 Detroit and encourage high attendance from BBYO members
 - Create an award for the chapter and/or person with the most community service hours in the region
 - Have a regional social action program at both Fall Conclave and Elections Training Conclave
 - Poverty, HIV/Aids, Genocide, Speaker on Drugs/Drinking
 - Encourage chapters to have at least three social action programs during the year
 - Create a calendar with social action topics for every month of the programming year
 - Encourage maximum attendance at AIPAC's High School Summit 2010
 - Have the attendee's of AIPAC's High School Summit plan a regional social action program

Stand Up! In Michigan Region:

- Focus on a broad cause and have community service and social action programs relating to the cause
 - Kids with Disabilities: Have a day of community service at the Friendship Circle, donate money to JARC Teens, and advocate for disability awareness
 - Inner-City Students: Create a long-term mentor/tutor community service project, collect and donate school supplies to Detroit elementary schools, and learn about the importance of education
 - ☼ The Homeless: Collect clothing and make blankets for community service, donate money to homeless shelters, and Stand Up! for those in need
