Goals As Mazkir

- Attend every chapter meeting in order to stay organized and on top of things.
- Take accurate minutes by bringing a laptop to every chapter meeting.
- Create a Google Doc of all of our minutes so they can be available at all times.
- Teach and inspire members to go on summer programs.

- Help all of the Katvanim become comfortable with calling members if they aren't already.
- Work with the S'gan to hold a summer program function.

Four Part System For Promotion of Summer Programs

- 1) Find out which Fisherman do not want to go on a summer program, and inform them on how great they are.
- 2) Have the Katvanim call their Fisherman, and tell them about the summer program for that month.
- 3) At each meeting I will share an interesting fact about the summer program of that month.
- 4) Any Fisherman, at any time, can email me or text me if they have any questions about any of the summer programs.

Big Ideas

Rework the Katvan System

For this year I would like to change the Katvan system. This past year we didn't have any Katvan, which is not a good thing. I want at least nine 8th or 9th graders to be Katvanim so everyone will be in the loop for when programs will be held. Since there will be at least nine Katvanim, this means that each Katvan will only have to call five Fisherman or less. I will teach each and every 8th grader about being a Katvan and if they don't want a position on board yet, but want to have a big impact on the chapter they will want to be a Katvan.

- Communicate with incoming 8th graders.
- Talk with any Fisherman that doesn't want to be on board.

Promoting Summer Programs

I would like to guarantee that at least one third of the chapter would be attending a summer program. To promote the summer programs, I will send out an email every month with an in-depth description for one summer program. Each month will be a different program. If any questions arise, I know I will be prepared to answer them and add even more information than needed.

- Each email will have a different summer program. Including ILSI, CLTC, Kallah, Impact programs, and Passport to the World.
- I will work with the Aleph Moreh to communicate with the current freshmen specifically about CLTC.
- Call and talk in person with Fisherman about summer programs.
