# GOALS & IDEAS

### International Board & Beyond

Motivate the Grand Board to maintain close relationships with each of their counterparts so that International Board and Regional Board don't seem so distant from one another

Create an online "Godol Forum" where counterparts can post issues and provide advice

Create monthly releases based on topics submitted by Regional Godolim at August Execs and during other times throughout the year

Revamp Task Forces to cover topics that are most relevant and important to the entire Order, and actually hold them accountable to presenting something throughout the year, like at IC 2011.

Continue the Elections Task Force to open up the BBYO democracy even more; possibly create a Constitutional Task Force to review the AZA & BBG constitutions and propose updates/amendments

Film a monthly "Fireside Chat" video with the International N'siah about news, important info, and more

Reevaluate the International Chair Network so that each position has a clearly defined purpose, and ask each I-Board member to complete a "Year Plan" with each of their chairs outlining what they will accomplish

Increase communication and strengthen the ties between BBYO here in North America, and BBYO elsewhere (like in Bulgaria, Israel, & the UK). Include their leadership in any Exec body communications, encourage higher attendance at summer programs like Passport to Bulgaria, and create an "International Relations Chair"

#### Back to the Grassroots

Success at the council, regional and even international level rely on the success of each chapter across our Order. We can strengthen everything from programming to membership, and from Judaic learning to leadership, by getting down to the grassroots of our movement.

Meet with chapter S'ganim and Morim during visits to discuss and outline concrete ways to strengthen membership & programming in their chapter through a "Five-Step Process"

Chapter S'ganim: more focus on creative programs; encourage chapters to pian at least one full-fold program every month.
Chapter Morim: more focus on the idea that every member should recruit, and that membership should be a year long process of slow but steady growth. Chapter Shlichim/Gizborim: get chapters more involved in local causes by utilizing "Stand UP! In-A-Box," a resource that outlines the process to

develop a campaign in a chapter or in

a region

#### Regional, Council, & Chapter Visits

Plan my regional visits strategically, so that I can truly help strengthen our Order as much as possible

Meet with staff and regional board members to identify problem areas and figure out what needs the most improvement through a "Top 5 Priorities" list

Work with the Regional Godol and other regional leaders to plan and

lead inspirational and educational programs during my visit

Get together with a group of chapter leaders in each region to get a feel for what they think the Grand Board should be focusing on, and where they think AZA should be headed Document certain parts of each regional visit on a FLIP carmoorder and

regional visit on a FLIP camcorder, and upload the clips to a "GAG Video Blog"

#### Miscellaneous

Establish an "Emergency Fund" to use during times of global disaster, so that BBYO as a whole can donate money and provide support for various causes

Increase relations with Tzameret in Israel by including them in the planning process of IC, ILSI, and other Israel-based trips Create a brand new AIT curriculum that teaches much more about membership, programming, and Stand UP!
