#### **GOALS AND IDEAS**

#### Community Service/Social Action

<u>Bookstock</u>: Bookstock is a group of organizations that raises money for non-profit organizations by selling used donated books to the public. Each organization can volunteer to help with this project and raise money for their group. By helping load books from donors into trucks we can earn money for our chapter.

<u>J-serve</u>: A community wide service event that changes every year. This year we cleaned and renovated the Downtown synagogue which needed our help with painting, washing, cleaning and organizing. I would like to keep our chapter very involved in J-Serve because I think it is great to be involved in helping the community.

Yad Ezra: Yad Ezra is a non-profit kosher food bank, where people drop off food for those who cannot afford to purchase their own. Yad Ezra has a schedule of who gets food and when, I would like to see our chapter volunteer there at least once during the upcoming programming year.

Grace Centers of Hope: Grace Centers of Hope is a shelter for people who don't have enough money to have their own home or food, due to substance abuse or crime. The shelter helps get their lives back on track. There are some pretty nice people at the shelter and it is a very nice building in Pontiac. I would like to have our chapter volunteer there at least once.

<u>Hospitality House</u>: Hospitality House is a food bank similar to Yad Ezra, at hospitality house they help out the less fortunate families with their struggle for food by distributing food to them, in certain amounts according to the number of people in their family. I think it would be very nice to have our chapter volunteer there a few times.

<u>Fall Fix Up</u>: Fall Fix Up is a program organized by JCC, Oak Park. People and groups from all over the city assist with residential home maintenance, like raking leaves and window repair for those individuals and elderly people who can't do it for themselves. Last fall I participated in the Fall Fix up. It might not have been the most fun thing I've ever done but it gave me a really good feeling that I had helped someone in need.

Social Action: If I am elected as Shaliach I would quickly inform our chapter about upcoming Rallies for Israel and any other Jewish topic, such as Israel's Birthday. I would also like to have our chapter involved in other social action events.
