Overall membership and AZA membership in CVR is currently at a 10 year high

Since coming onto regional board I've effectively helped establish 2 new chapters in Willimantic, Connecticut and Longmeadow, Massachusetts. I've also helped a BBYO chapter split and remain stable on both the AZA side and the BBG side.

In the past 2 years I've helped the chapters in my region raise over \$20,000 for organizations such as the United Jewish Federation, Relay For Life, and Making Strides against Breast Cancer

Attendance at regional events is currently at a 10 year high with close to 65% of our members attending conventions

l've played a large role in coordinating J-serve in Connecticut as a state-wide event rather than separate community programs.

I revived the Westchester BBYO region by coordinating, planning, and running every program for them in 2010. After starting the year with 0 involved members they now have close to 70 which gives them enough momentum to become their own region.

I've been able to effectively sort out strengths and weaknesses amongst my board and delegate responsibility accordingly which has contributed to our maximized production and efficiency this year.

By connecting regions and counterparts with similar issues we can work faster on solving problems thus giving each region more time to work on new, innovative initiatives for their region to strive under.

In conjunction with the initial attempt to connect counterparts and regions there will also have to be a strong follow-up that occurs as regions go through the process of putting their plans into action. I've come to realize through my experiences in BBYO that every plan has a flaw that will eventually be exposed at one point or another. It's important that when those flaws are exposed the region dealing with the issue has a strong network of people to rely on to help them when things don't go the way they're expected too.

Moving into our 87th year I fully expect it to be the strongest year our movement has ever seen. By working together and becoming more efficient we'll have more time to reach out into our communities and focus on improving the world one step at a time.
