### Actions, Accomplishments, Advancements

Five years of role modeling, hard work, and dedication have taught me the strategies necessary for strengthening any BBYO community. In Central Region West, I have...

#### Meaningfully Reorganized Leadership

- Served in **two regional board positions**, building on experience to ensure a smooth transition of leadership.
- Created and managed 28 regional chair positions that have changed the way members of CRW identify with the region.
- Led three steering committees, bringing more Alephs and BBGs into the regional programming process.

### **Empowered Local Leaders**

- Founded Peninsula AZA #545, bringing leadership opportunities to Alephs in the Burlingame-Millbrae area.
- Founded Sam Beber AZA #42, bringing an AZA experience to young men in San Francisco, CA.
- Worked with DBG AZA #2143 to triple their active membership, enabling 40+ Alephs to experience a thriving chapter.
- Worked with Dreidel AZA #2525 to create consistent programming and triple their membership, ensuring the growth of an AZA stronghold in the Oakland-Berkeley area.
- Worked with Marika Winheld BBYO #5224 to create a standard of leadership and doubling their membership, redefining what it means to be a BBYO chapter.

### **Developed Valuable Resources**

- Created a Shaliach resource bank accessible online to Sh'lichim worldwide.
- Maintained CRW Program bank of hundreds of programs, providing inspiration and resources for programmers everywhere.
- Co-authored **CRW Guide to Programming**, setting up S'ganim throughout the region for success.
- Wrote the first CRW Siddur, revolutionizing the way a pluralistic community prays together.
- **Coordinated two conventions**, re-imagining the way leadership and Jewish content are programmed for.

#### **Made Communication Count**

- Maintained constant interaction and feedback with ten members of the steering committee for IC 2010 and 2011 as a steering member and Administrative Assistant.
- Unified a body of regional chairs in cooperative progress through new means of communication.
- Worked with five counterpart networks, encouraging teamwork and collective success through constant interaction and availability.

### Laying Groundwork, Ensuring Success

With my leadership and the leadership of others, CRW has experienced tremendous growth in the past two years. We have:

- Increased membership from 430 to 600 members
- Created a thriving pluralistic Jewish community
- Increased average convention attendance from 150 members to 250+ participants
- Started four new chapters, bringing BBYO to new and formerly unserved places.
- Sent two of the largest delegations to International Convention (2010 & 2011): 53 & 109
- Created a culture where growth & depth are valued: 19 thriving chapters with quality programming each week.

# **Building Our Movement at Every Level**

## Reorganize Leadership Meaningfully

Redefine the role of the Grand board to focus on involving and engaging as many Alephs as possible in international leadership to instill a sense of pride and ownership throughout the order.

Implement a committee system to open up international leadership to more Alephs than ever before.

Empower strong chapter and regional leaders to become International leaders by reaching out to those in need in other BBYO communities.

## **Develop Valuable Resources**

Gather resources from throughout the BBYO community—FAN, professional staff, and other chapters and regions—to distribute to those in need.

Use existing technologies to allocate necessary resources. (e.g. YouTube videos, blogs, resource websites, and more.)

Redefine counterpart networks to be mutually responsible communities which create and exchange resources for better regions and chapters everywhere.

## **Make Communication Count**

Maintain a consistent stream of communication before, during, and after a visitation with chapter and regional leaders to make my time in your region as effective and productive as possible.

Foster a detailed and ongoing conversation about leadership throughout our order. Elevate our movement through sharing the successful aspects of our communities.

**Establish a channel for two-way communication.** Make ways for international leaders to reach chapter members and for everyone to provide the international leadership with feedback.

## **Empower Local Leaders**

Make resources that help chapters use International initiatives to their benefit: for example, StandUp! to grow membership, SpeakUp! to fortify chapter programming.

Train regional counterparts to better train their counterparts, strengthening the transmission of resources, skills and knowledge.

Find new ways to foster interregional communication between chapter leaders, opening up their resource pool to the rest of the order (e.g. use the CLTC follow up network)
