GLOBALIZATION

- Overseas members at international programs-Continue I\$F fundraising to bring international teens to programs like ILTC, CLTC, ILSI and IC.
- Resources and programing- provide assistance to small and isolated Jewish communities.
- Leverage technology- keep in constant contact and share resources with our overseas affiliates.
- Expand with purpose- Globalize to achieve our goal of reaching more Jewish teens, not just for the right to say "we're globalized."
- Reach out- encourage chapters and regions to connect with AZAs overseas and learn what it is like to be a lew in archier country.

UNITE JEWISH TEENS

- United we stand, divided we fall- support the Coalition of Jewish Teen Leaders (presidents of all Jewish Teen Movements). We are more effective as one united force.
- Build relationships- advocate for CJTL to partner with organizations that have similar goals (JNF, AIPAC, JDC, ADL).
- Expand the council- to promote dialogue on all levels between regional and chapter boards as well.
- Long term- CJTL should represent he teen voice at the Conference of Presidents of Major dewish Organizations

REGIONAL VISITS

- Plan strategically- focus on regions that need advice and assistance.
- Set clear goals- meet with regional board members and chapter Godolim to create a one year plan with defined objectives.
- Work with regional leadership to plan engaging programs during visits.
- Inspire young Alephs about the incredible world of BBYO.

ISRHEL

- Join the Israel on Campus Coalition- cement BBYO as the leading pro-Israel youth movement.
- Expand Speak Up- move our newest advocacy initiative overseas.
- AIPAC- maintain our partnership with America's leading pro-Israel lobby.
- Create overseas partnerships- Because AIPAC is an exclusively American organization, we must partner with international organizations as well.
- Tzameret- increase relations with our affiliate in Israel. Include them in the BBYO democracy, and encourage networking.

COMMUNICATION

- Godol Blog- update regularly so AZAs can follow my travel and experiences.
- Integrate Program Bank- include categories for Stand Up and Speak Up.
- True Resource Sharing- every Grand Board member must maintain comprehensive resources available to all members.

GRASSROOTS

- Power lies in the chapter- programming, recruitment, and education all start on this level. Chapters must be prioritized.
- Return focus to the Aleph- never lose touch with our roots as a fraternity.

- GAG is more than the president of AZA- The GAG represents not just BBYO members, but the entire Jewish community. BBYO policy, regional visits, and activism should reflect this.

PROGRAM EXCELLENCE

- Five folds- encourage use of the five folds as a guide rather than required objectives and educate members on the value of all five folds.
- Open conference calls- highlight the order's best programming. Post detailed outlines of featured programs on Program Bank.
- Program planning curriculum- create an universal curriculum with the Grand Aleph S'gan for use at teadership training.

MEMBERSHIP

- Teen Connection- continue to transfer responsibility and control to teen leaders.
- Progression- create a smooth transition from Teen
 Connection to BBYO to FAN
