Programming

- Using the Five folds as a tool to create brotherhood
- Planning programs that evoke distinct feelings of brotherhood
- Offering a variety of ways for members to discover personal Jewish identities through diverse programming

Judaic Integration

- Utilizing Judaism to instill a bond between all alephs
- Educating about Jewish values and lessons to establish a strong Jewish identity and support in chapter/region
- Coming together through services and other forms of prayer

Communication

- Establishing an open atmosphere for Alephs
- Strong system of information transfer to keep every aleph working towards chapter/ regional goals
- Using Communication as a means of unification

Recruitment

- Hold every chapter accountable for maintaining the membership-mile
 - Recruiting two members a month
- Create guide around how to effectively interact with new members and prospects
 - How to transition a conversation to support BBYO
 - Use List, Contact, Close
- Establish an International Initiative to recruit members with core values of brotherhood
- Make The Tree of Life more prestigious in all regions
 - Connect all regions through competitions of recruitment
- Incorporate BBYO 5-year Strategic Plan
 - Reach 70,000 Jews by 2016

Education

Education will be a **primary focus** of my term as Grand Aleph Moreh, establishing a **Correct Education Initiative** to instill brotherhood through strong education.

7 Objectives

- Objectives at the core of AZA
 - Committees to efficiently instill lessons
 - Effective guides that teach board members how to establish a willingness to expand upon these lessons
 - Useful methods that allow the integration of these objectives into five-fold programming
- Make CLTC rooted in accomplishing these objectives

7 Cardinal Principles

- Develop committees around the seven cardinal Principles
 - Methods that give members the desire to learn songs that unite us: Up You Men, Stand Together, etc.
- Use CLTC as an experience to widen member's understanding of the Principles and their importance
- Incorporate the use of the Educational Framework in all regions

Retention

- Create Regional chair position dedicated to working with the International Retention Committee
 - Identify and create templates that effectively articulate how to use brotherhood as a tool to keep members active
- Plan grade-specific events for Juniors and Seniors
 - Create grade-specific traditions that younger members strive to take part in
- Use strong education as a tool to keep members active
 - Set the precedent for strong members in the future
- Institute regional competitions to push Alephs around the Order to work for International recognition
