### Chapters

#### Members Must Own the Priorities

- Create releases that provide easy to understand explanations of **how** general members can promote and act on the priorities.
- Have a conference call with all chapter counterparts once every two months to explain the progress of our movement. In addition, we will discuss the next steps necessary to allow our order progress the next level.

#### F Every Aleph Recruits

- The 876 Campaign is the beginning of a new mentality, in which every Aleph has the responsibility to recruit new members.
- All You Have To Do is Ask- Every Aleph should ensure that their Jewish friends have the same opportunity to have the same experience, brotherhood, and fraternity that he does on a daily basis.

#### (Connect Chapters Across the Order

- Use the Stand UP website to connect chapters with similar causes. Chapters can work together to develop stronger service, advocacy, and philanthropy projects.
- Connect chapters that are similar in size to collaborate on improving programming, recruitment, communications, and fundraisers.

### **Regional/Council**

#### P Develop a Strong Regional Counterpart Networks

- This will allow regional counterparts in similarly structured regions to share their successes and difficulties. These networks will be able to develop and perfect program ideas for regional events that will have a lasting impact on Alephs.
- Create counterpart projects specific for each position that chapter boards can use.

#### Promote More Inter-Regional Conventions

- East Coast Kallah is the paradigm for inter-regional programs. Conventions similar to ECK should be held all over the country to increase the brotherhood and unity in our order.
- · Compete in inter-regional AZAA tournaments.
- · Celebrate AZA Shabbat with different regions.

#### # Start a Tradition of Giving Money to ISF

- At February XX, each region will present a check for ISF in front of the Executive Body.
- This tradition will unify our order because we are all committing to World Jewry together.
- The checks will be based upon the amount pledged by each region at the beginning of the year.

#### PRe-Vamp Leadership Network

- Create transparency through the Leadership Network Press.
  - ✓ This new chair will compile all of the progress that each chair has made and publish a monthly newsletter.
- The Global Ambassador Network should become a senior internship that works directly with the BBYO Staff and JDC.
  - ✓ Reintroduce a head ambassador.
  - ✓ Hold a Global Awareness Bootcamp before the Ambassadors begin to work.
  - ✓ Celebrate AZA Shabbat and J-Serve with International communities.

### International

#### Done Board, One Team, One Unit

- The 88th Grand Board will act and function as one unit.
  - ✓ All wins will be considered a success for the entire board.
  - Every board member will fully understand and be able to advocate for every priority.
  - ✓ This will create a cohesive mentality and will set the example for all regional, council, and chapter boards.

# Perfecting the Visit

#### Pre-Visit

The pre-planning can make or break the success of a visit. Two weeks before a visit, I, along with the rest of the Grand Board, will reach out to our regional and local counterparts.
