Pluralism: Serving as **Chapter Godol**, I reached out to teens all over the Denver area from many different backgrounds and denominational affiliations. By embodying pluralism and being accepting of every Jewish teen that wanted to join, our membership increased from 9 Alephs to 35. Serving on the **International Jewish Content Committee**, I fully grasped how diverse every Jewish teen is and how we need to accommodate each individual to ensure everyone gets the most meaning out of Judaic programming. Being the **Jewish Administrator for the only pluralistic Jewish high school in Denver**, I enhance Judaic programming and encourage expression from every student no matter their Jewish affiliation.

Commitment to the State of Israel: Serving as **Regional Aleph Godol**, I set a precedent in activism and advocacy for the state of Israel, leading many programs and raising money for Speak Up, as well as stirring up passion for our Jewish Home land. **I was the lead teen organizer involved** in a counterdemonstration against the anti-Israel, anti-Jewish Westboro Baptist Church.

Tikkun Olam: By spreading the message of the Aleph Zadik Aleph throughout Wyoming, New Mexico and Colorado, **I have inspired others to become leaders** and make an impact in their communities. With leadership tools in hand, community service was done and money was raised for chapter's causes.
