The Next Step for The Degrees of Programming

Further Steps/Goals

Promote Inter-regional programming: I will work with regional S'ganim to offer more opportunities for teens to go to conventions with Alephs in other regions, with ideas like multi-region AZA Shabbats, and starting up a convention like East Coast Kallah in other places across North America.

Contact availability: I promise to be there for any Aleph who needs help, no matter what. I will also contact every S'gan in the Order by the end of each term.

Chairs: Chairs serve as a good introduction to leadership on an international level. One chair in specific that I want to create this term is the Chapter Programming Chair. This chair would focus specifically on chapter programming, and reporting on excellent programming across the Order.

Counterpart Communication

Communication must be a cornerstone of programming on all levels, from chapter programming to working with counterparts, to coordinating an international convention.

- The key to counterpart communication is to know your counterpart. I promise to call all regional counterparts bi-weekly to ensure that I know how each S'gan is doing: where they're succeeding, where they're struggling, and how I can best assist them.
- In addition to regular counterpart calls, I will focus in on the regions that need the most help, and work with them to develop and strengthen their region's programming.
- I want communication to not just be between myself and my counterparts, but also for there to be open lines of discussion between various regions. If I notice that some of my counterparts are facing similar issues, I will put them in communication with each other so that they can share ideas and solutions for their issues.
- Monthly releases made by myself and chairs, covering various aspects of the position of S'gan and sharing knowledge from around the Order.
- Work with counterparts to use programming rebuild our traditions and exemplify our Fraternity.
