

Improve promotion of the Program Bank by instructing Regions and Councils to make submitting quality programs to the Program Bank a priority. Also, change the "Featured Program" section to "Program of the Month" to keep up the Program Bank's momentum.

Timeline/Assessment

I will outline for every Aleph the process that should be followed for the planning of a program. This will include everything from putting together a committee to putting it on Dashboard to finishing the write-up. I also want to make sure that every Aleph formally assesses their programs so that they can improve their skills after each program.

Degrees of Programming

Measure program quality by cohesiveness of fold types instead of only the quantity. Make the Degrees part of the Program Bank Submission process in order to enhance implementation. Allow the Program Bank Chairs to determine which Degree the program is; this will ensure that only 2nd and 3nd Degree programs are on the Program Bank, so that chapters will only entulate the most superb programs we have to offer.

UNIFICATION THROUGH PROGRAMMING

Group together Regions and Councils of different sizes or structures so that they can communicate different styles of programming. This will allow Regions and Councils to view different programming methods and their success. Work to further incorporate Overseas BBYO in our Programming. Assign multiple Regions to an overseas country with BBYO chapters. Have a chapter in one of the Regions plan a program with their assigned country each month. After both chapters do the program, they can compare their experiences with the program.

MAKING PROGRAMS ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY

As a progressive movement, we should be setting an example by reducing our Carbon Footprint in any way we can during AZA programs. Create a Committee called the BBYO Green Programming Committee that will help to make programs more sustainable. They will develop a set of guidelines that will minimize AZA's environmental impact, and they will make releases that explain how to make programs more eco-friendly. Also, have an International Simultaneous Program called AZA Earth Day; on Earth Day, each chapter will be encouraged to have educational programming on the environment and our effect on it.

INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD WEEKEND

Currently, brotherhood in AZA is adequate, but a revitalization of the International Brotherhood Weekend would strengthen the bond between Alephs across the Order. A Fraternity Overnight will take place during this weekend, and prior to the Brotherhood Weekend, I will send a release that outlines certain aspects of programming every chapter should include for the weekend. A weekend of brotherhood-oriented programming throughout AZA would have an amazing impact on morale and enthusiasm on our Order.

International Convention 2012

IC 2012 in Atlanta will be incredible because I will ensure that the programming at IC sets the benchmark programming in the Order. Also, I will involve more Alephs Overseas by having a conference call with the leaders of Overseas BBYO and the IC Steering Committee so their opinions can be heard and implemented. Finally, improve AZAA by having the champions of each Region/Council compete at

COUNTERPART COMMUNICATION

I will send out a monthly release that will have the most exceptional programs from the previous month, as well as programming ideas for the month ahead. I will have counterpart calls with each of the Regional/Council S'ganim so that I can use the feedback to improve my releases and overall assistance. I will ensure that I am accessible to every S'gan as well as any other Aleph who wants to plan a program.

OVERSEAS PROGRAMMING

In order to bridge the gap between Overseas and North American S'ganim, I will create an Overseas Programming Chair that will keep Overseas BBYO informed of International Initiatives as well as find innovative programs from Overseas to put on an "International Section" of the Program Bank to show our diversity and continuity of programming.
