Goals and Ideas:

68th, 88th, Staff, Me, and the AC Godol:

- Hold weekly BBG council board meetings
- Hold joint council board meetings once a month
- Stay in constant communication with staff, 88th AC Godol, board, Dixie Council and N'siah, Int'l N'siah, Counterparts, 68th AC BBG Board
- Meet with Godol before and during the summer

- Attend 1 program for all chapters each semester
- Hold monthly president meetings

The International Order:

- Represent Atlanta Council proudly on the international level
- Inspire record-breaking participation at IC 2017 with recruitment of MITs-Seniors

Dixie Council:

- Skype Dixie members for SRC to further involve them in planning
- Allow Southern Region Chairs to plan a program at SRC
- Create Southern monthly updates to send out to promote Southern Region Unity

YALL:

- Offer a complete fall and spring session of YALL to maximize participants
- YALL: Create a fun, engaging curriculum for Alephs and BBG's
- Allow YALL Participants to plan events at SRC, ACSC, and Sunday Funday

Summer Programs:

- Create summer program spirit packs
- Send letters to BBG's on summer programs
- Host monthly summer program info sessions for parents and teens considering attendance
- Allow all CLTC and ILTC participants to plan a Council-wide program together at LTI
- Allow International Kallah participants to plan a Council-wide program at Council Kallah
- Have comprehensive chapter representation at every summer program

Programming:

- Establish a Sunday Funday Steering Committee that will spearhead programming
- Improve AC Program Bank to benefit chapters
- Host a Chapter Programming Showcase at SRC for chapters across Southern Region to show their best program to the Region
- Have Coffeehouse once per semester
- Create an AC Supply bank so chapters don't always have to go out and buy supplies
- Incorporate international initiatives into programming on the council and chapter level

Membership:

- Identify and implement responsibilities for MIT Rep.
- Have grade representatives (one AZA, one BBG per grade)
- Grow AC BBG by 125 members
- Have 100 MITs at New Member Convention 2016
- Incorporate MRIHA (Meet, Record, Invite, Host, Ask) strictly to AC BBG Chapters
- Broaden community outreach to Jewish middle schools by posting notices in The Jewish Times

Judaism:

- Create monthly council-wide Shabbat services via Google Hangout in which chapters or a steering committee will lead services
- Partner with USY & NFTY once per semester
- Offer a larger variety of services at conventions

Communication, Promotion and Fundraising:

- Create an Atlanta Council Shuk page
- Have monthly chapter evaluations through Google Plus Calls
- Work with the Council Mazkirah and chapter mazkirot to submit monthly updates to then be sent to The Jewish Times

BBYO Connect:

- Go to middle schools to talk about BBYO once per semester
- Ensure Council Board representation at all Connect events
- Have chapter N'siot be active within BBYO Connect
- Create enthusiasm about BBG during Connect events
- Give chapter Mekasherim all the support and resources needed to succeed

Atlanta Council Unity:

- Create families: one older BBG, one older Aleph paired together with one MIT, one AIT within the council, all from different chapters
- Encourage the use of brother/sister chapters
- Form Junior/ Senior Overnight into a bonding experience for all
- Promote BBG inclusivity through AC BBG Hangouts and Overnights
