



- To create and implement an all new and much improved Big Brother program, responsible for seeing that every chapter gets the attention and guidance from Council that they deserve. Each Council Exec. will recieve two little brother chapters and he is responsible for attending a minimum of one meeting per month. If one meeting is not held in a particular month, the big brother must find out why. Contact between chapter presidents and the big brother must occur in order for the program to be successful. Monthly reports at the Council Exec. Board meeting will be mandatory. The Council Exec. needs to help his little brother chapters reach all of the goals that they have set for themselves. If this program is a success, membership, programming in all folds and active Regional participation are all easily attainable chapter goals. This goal will only be accomplished if all parties involved remain willing to participate all year.


- To replenish both the Scholarship fund and the Senior Citizen Plan fund, in order to continue to make events less expensive for seniors and scholarship winners. As the Region brings in more money from new fundraisers, some of the funds that are not used to subsidize conclaves and conventions can be put into both funds.

- To look to local businesses in the Jewish Community for monetary donations in exchange for advertisements in our newspaper and yearbook. Public relations are going to become a key part of our Order. If other organizations and businesses are made aware of our active participation in the Jewish Community during the year, then they will want to attach their name to publications that we create.


- To see that more attention is given to the out-state chapters to ensure that they continue to grow and function with other chapters. This job, traditionally that of the Aleph S'gan Shlishee, must be taken more seriously. The Windsor and Ann Arbor chapters must feel as comfortable in our Region as the West Bloomfield chapters. Participation in all Regional events must be encouraged and alternatives (cheaper, easier) methods of transportation must be looked into. Also, it is important that we function in Canada and Ann Arbor more often.

- To help any struggling chapters regain strength, through active participation, so that new chapters can be started. Problems must be identified quickly. If membership is low, we must push and assist with recruitment. If money is short, we must push and assist with fundraising. If the elected officials are ineffective, then others should be encouraged to take leadership roles. Each problem has a solution and since each chapter will be getting attention from their big brother, they will have the knowledge of a Council officer to guide them.

- To ensure that all current chapters are stable and capable of remaining that way before adding any more new chapters. A recruitment incentive must be implemented to keep chapters recruiting.

- To launch membership statistics through the roof, by way of phone-a-thons, membership prizes and awards, and encouragement of chapter Aleph Morim.
- To work with the Regional Aleph Gizbor to find fundraising alternatives to the much-disliked Candy Sale in order to decrease costs of conclaves, conventions and leagues.
- To creat a complete and helpful "events" calendar, one that also includes Milan dates, in the BBYO office to prevent Regional over-programming and thereby encouraging attendance at events.
- To re-implement Judaism into BBYO, the world's largest Jewish youth organization. Respect for the religiousness of our Order must be stressed to all members. If you are not a firm believer in G-d, no one will force you into prayer, but you must show respect for others during a service by keeping quiet and not complaining. In order for Judaism to survive in this world, we must learn our heritage so that we can teach it to others.
- To see that counterpart seminars are more effective in helping chapter officers detect and solve problems that chapters are having by stressing the importance of these meetings to Council Execs and chapter officers. Without a firm belief that counterpart seminars will work by all involved parties, they won't.
- To emphasize the importance of the Aleph Kohane Godol's position on the exec. board through encouragement toward active participation in all events.
- To always be around and willing to listen to the problems or concerns of any and all chapter members.
- To enthusiastically participate as a counterpart to both chapter Godolim and the Regional N'siah.
- To devote as much time to supporting and guiding my little brother chapters as to my own chapter.
- To proudly and accurately represent Michigan Region on the International level.
