


Senior Retention

- ④ Hold a senior tribute night so the seniors know how much pair knows each other the best.
- ④ Have a Big/Lil Sister slumber party; Big/Lil Sisters bonding activities, separates, and a contest to see which someone looking out for their interests.
- ④ Have lots of Big/Lil Sister events so older members have a sense of responsibility and younger members have to the chapter regularly.
- ④ Let each and every member know how important they are to the chapter and what they can do for the chapter.
- ④ Make senior class yearbooks that the rest of the chapter will write messages in at the beginning of the year to keep seniors motivated.
- ④ Create a senior slide show to be shown at senior lives.

- ④ Because there is no longer a "recruitment season", we have to recruit year round:
- ④ Recruit at least four new members per month throughout the year
- ④ Have the chapter as a whole be involved in the recruitment process so we can get the word out to more prospectives
- ④ Pass around a notebook at meetings for members to write down names and contact information for prospectives they know
- ④ Call prospectives before events to encourage them to come
- ④ Have lots of interesting sisterhood programs to give prospectives a comfortable first event
- ④ Set up an amazing and creative booth at spring kick off so eighth graders will see how awesome Ruach is
- ④ Send prospectives the weeklies so they know about upcoming events



- ④ Hold an informational meeting at the beginning of the year with the N'siah and new parents about what BBYO is
- ④ Have four M&M Education programs throughout the year
 - ④ An M&M Education program is a *Meaningful and Memorable* education program. They are meaningful because of the educational value, and memorable because the MITs were able to have fun while learning.



M&M Education Programs

- September: MIT Sleepover - Hold a "mini program" in each fold to teach the MITs what each fold is and how to program in them.
- December: How to Plan a Successful Multi-Fold Program - Show the MITs how to integrate multiple folds into one program with a common theme. I would set up six posters and break the MITs up into six groups. Each group would have one fold and would go from poster to poster adding their fold to the program being created.
- February: Summer Programs Education - Give the MITs a "crash course" on everything you need to know about summer programs, scholarships and how to pick the right program for you.
- March: How to Make a Great Platform/ Elections Information - Hold a platform workshop. Explain to the MITs the process of noms and decs as well as what to expect on Election Day. Have a collection of chapter, regional, and international platforms and go over the positives and negatives, and what to put in a platform.
