Recruitment:

As a region, we are lucky to have new freshmen come into our chapters rather than seek them out like other regions. But that doesn't mean we still can't go and reach out to those not experiencing the wonders of AZA. Utilizing BBYO Connect and all other available resources, I will work with and educate the upcoming Alephs on our fraternity. They will be the future leaders of NTO, and the proper guidance will push them to greater heights. And what about those men who are not yet exposed to AZA? I will create individual committees in each chapter to find those teens in their respective schools, temples, etc, explain who and what we are and have them attend a project. That may be enough to guide them into AZA.

Retention:

Members. The very foundation of the Aleph Zadik Aleph. Nothing we, as an Order, achieved would be possible or even thought of without the member, whether young or old. While we try to bring in all the members we can, we sometimes forget about the current members we have, which may lead to a feeling of being forgotten and they ultimately burn out. Gentlemen, we CANNOT allow that to happen. We need the older members as our brothers in guidance and wisdom and also as invaluable people. I want to emphasize Big Brother-Little Brother relationships, where the bond as brothers both young and old strengthens. The younger members will help find their place in their chapters, and the older members will feel needed and responsible for making this happen.

Re-Education:

There is always the pressure of making five-fold programs without them being too erratic. That can't absorb the focus of the chapter while making other aspects suffer, especially the educational part. Most AITs are taught the history, but have difficulty remembering what they were taught. Besides chapters planning at least one re-education project, I would like to plan a regional re-education event. Learning our history collectively as brothers strengthens the memory and the people.

Goals

BBYO Connect:

We, as a region, have an excellent opportunity in BBYO Connect, the in-between BBYO experience of pre—and post—Bar/Bat Mitzvah and actual BBYO. These young men are the future of our Order, and we can help them have a smoother transition to AZA once they are of age. That's why I want to improve the interaction/communication with the chapters and BBYO Connect. I would like to have different members from each chapter attend the next BBYO Connect event and talk to the kids about their own personal BBYO experience.

Summer Programs:
