Picture Books (MITs)

- Encourage MITs to attend conventions
- Hold a parent meeting to help MIT parents understand BBYO**
- Create a group chat with MITs
- Create a thorough MIT packet
- Text each MIT individually every month
- Hold fun but informational MIT board elections
- Help MIT Board plan at least 2 events**
- Have at least 3 MIT sleepovers
- Make sure MITs have upperclassmen contact information so they have rides to events**

Classics (Seniors)

- Pair members who are both participating in RC so they can give gifts and encouragement there**
- Create a secret gift exchange around the holidays
- Have a night out with sisters: dinner and then ice cream

Textbooks (The 3 R's)

Recruitment

- Create a group chat with prospectives
- Set up a reward system for those who recruit a member**
- Goal of recruiting at least 15 active members
- Make sure N'siah has information about new members to give them shoutouts in the emails
- Attend freshman and 8th grade rush
- Create spreadsheet with information about prospectives that any member can add to**

Retention

- Advertise events in creative ways
- Drop off a calendar and a treat to members who haven't been to events in a while**
- Include all grades in all events
- Send a "We miss you" text to members that haven't come to a function in a while
- Create a guide with members' birthdays and have myself and other members text them so they feel appreciated by the chapter**
- Create promo videos about upcoming events
- Have rewards for active members who come to a certain number of events in a certain amount of time
- Create an address book so events are in different places that are convenient to a lot of members
- Create a book with the contact information of members who can drive**

Re-education

- Distribute MIT packet to any other members who would like to learn more about BBYO
- Work with Mazkirah to add BBYO fun facts to our social media**
- Hold informative parent meetings
- Make "What to Expect" bags and notes for MITs before conventions**
- Help MIT board be active and involved
- Encourage members to go to YLC
- Hold an event with Katvanit to educate members about summer programs
- Make myself a resource for all members that have questions, using the knowledge I gained from YLC and CLTC
- Create quick Jeopardy/Kahoot games for MIT sleepovers
