When You call My Name: Sisterhood, Membership, and Unity

- Work closely with the chapter MIT Mom and Big Sister chair to introduce MIT's to our chapter and give them the best experience possible
- o Get to know MIT's and all chapter members on a personal level
- Make recruitment and retention priorities by involving the whole chapter and encouraging members across all grade levels to engage in these activities both independently and as a chapter
- Reduce chapter drama, especially around elections, by discussing procedures and other leadership opportunities beforehand and expressing my availability to talk to members before and after elections
- Reinstate Good-and-Welfare programs in both the traditional "go around the circle and share" forms and new formats (ex: "Ask Amy"- write letters to other BBG's and get them answered, or "Breaking Boundaries"- small group question and answer) as a chance to grow closer as CC sisters
- Make sure the fold of sisterhood is prominent as a component of other programs and in its own light
- o Make sure chapter and MIT sleepovers are have meaningful programming
- Have a chapter bonding sleepover in addition to the WC one
- o Plan a chapter summer retreat and/or 1-day convention

Making Our Prayers Heard: Communication

- Remain in constant, two-way contact with our advisors to let them know what we are doing in our chapter and remain informed about upcoming citywide events and initiatives
- Keep parents in the know with regards to CC with frequent email releases about upcoming events and snail mail calendars (courtesy of our Katvanit)
- Release important information to the chapter via emails, Facebook posts, and texts and calls from the Mazkirah and Katvanit
- Work Closely with the NC council N'siah, our very own Judith Cohen, the VAC N'siah, and the International N'siah to stay updated on events outside of Chai Chaverim
- Continually communicate with the board and chairs to ensure that they have no problems in fulfilling and exceeding their duties in our chapter

Praying Together: Board Cohesion and Efficiency

- 1. Initiate regular individual, peer, and group board effectiveness evaluations
- Hold frequent board meetings and a board bonding each term to make sure that the whole board continues to work as a team
- Have all board members and chairs make a calendar/plan of how they will implement their goals to be reviewed and coordinated as one board entity at board bonding
- Equalize the two board terms: elect and install the spring term board before
 Winter Cultural to prevent fall-term burn-outs and make sure spring term
 board members get a full chance to implement their goals
- Fairly and effectively delegate responsibilities to the board, chairs, committees, and beyond as appropriate
- Have a board meeting/board bonding with the other Charlotte chapters to promote city cohesion and work with the other presidents to organize sessions for all 4 co's in each position to have joint planning
- Have a newbie/oldie "what I wish I'd known" both terms where the old board gives advice to the new board and helps them make a plan to implement their goals
- Be proactive in troubleshooting problems board members may have with their responsibilities
- Stay in the loop with the NCC and Charlotte presidents to promote congruency and make sure that all of the great ideas we have are shared across chapters for the most effective leadership possible
- Help make sure that the whole board works cohesively to create engaging multifold programs

Presence outside Of Chai

- 6 Encourage and empower chapter members to coordinate and steer conventions
