Globalization

Objective: Promote Global Jewry through the expansion and strengthening of our partnerships and global communities.

- ~ Obliterate the idea of "North American" and "Non North American"; stress the idea that we are all global Jewish teens united through common values and interests
- ~ Create a collection of globalization programs implementable in chapters, regions, and councils of varying experience with globalization programming
- Work with counterparts and the S'ganim movement to establish the mindset that any program can incorporate globalization in a way that is both educational and inspiring
- ~ Foster a love and passion for globalization in BBYO's youngest members by utilizing our global connections and impact as a "selling point" for BBYO Connect teens transitioning to BBG Chapters.
- ~ Expand upon Global Networking Teen Calls; theme based on relevant and interesting social issues to which every teen around the world can relate in a unique way
- ~ Promote all globalization efforts to regions/ councils through M'GOSK counterparts
- -Form personal relationships and hold monthly one-on-one calls with global counterparts in order to strengthen global relationships and serve as a liaison between countries/regions/partnerships

Fundraising and ISF

Objective: Reinvent the way we look at 1SF and philanthropic efforts in order to strengthen fundraising on all levels.

- ~ Stress ISF as an extension of Stand UP; emphasize that we're not just sending teens to BBYO programs, but expanding the impact of our movement in our global communities
- ~ Be completely transparent with goals and progress through updates to the AZA and BBG website and an online "thermometer" so that regions/councils know how close they are to reaching their goals and where they fit in to collective pledges throughout the Order
- ~ Stress ISF as entirely implementable at the chapter level; surpass this year's chapter pledge goal (70) and strive for 90+ chapters to pledge money to ISF next year
- ~ Emphasize community engagement through all ISF fundraising
- ~ Expand upon the BBYO Program Bank to include a fundraising section through which members can upload successful endeavors and browse for inspiration

Personal Promises

Objective: Continue to be the best leader and BBG I can possibly be.

- ~ Put forth 100% of my full and undivided effort throughout the entirety of my term
- ~ Inspire members to see BBYO, BBG, and our ever-expanding potential as a globalizing movement as I do
- ~ Remain accessible as a resource and a friend to every B'nai B'rith Girl

Marketing and Communication

Objective: Utilize the extensive resources available to us in order to bolster and enrich BBYO's image and allow members to do the same.

- ~ Work in tandem with the international office/PR team on all international releases and promotional materials
- ~ Maintain BBYO's image as a globally impactful youth movement; release a "How to Explain BBYO" guide so that this image is maintained as positive and uniform through all press and community interactions
- ~ Establish an online BBYO Photo Bank that can serve as a resource for flyers, and releases, as well as a way for interested community members to explore BBYO through a visually captivating medium
- ~ Host a "Best of BBYO Branding" competition to recognize best use of branding in flyers, promotional materials, clothing, etc.
- ~ Encourage use of "unconventional" marketing tactics through recognition of chapters, councils, and regions that successfully promote events through mediums other than Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.
- ~ Reinvent, maintain, market and utilize *The Shofar Newsletter*; include articles written and pictures taken by members of the ILN, the Grand and International Boards, and members at the regional, council, and chapter levels; publish online and make available to the public in order to further spread the image of BBYO as a "movement making a difference"

ILN

Objective: Expand upon the impact of the ILN by creating more opportunities for passionate Alephs and BBGs while improving overall organization and commitment to goals.

- ~ Strive to select enthusiastic and devoted committee members in order to create the most efficient and influential committees possible
- Incorporate GNC and GAP-C projects with one another in order to synergize and improve quality
- ~ Encourage committee members to take the lead on individual projects
- Select GNC and GAP-C chairs (two per committee) with distinct visions and goals for their work in the coming year

70th Board

Objective: Be a supportive and productive member of the International Board

- Assist fellow board members in the realization of their goals
 Take active minutes during all international
- Take active minutes during all international board conference calls and meetings
- ~ Attend all board retreats and meetings
- ~ Work closely with my Co throughout the year on all possible projects
- Remain with the mindset that we must not limit one position to one aspect of our movement, and lend a hand in any international project regardless of which priority it falls under

M'GOSK Counterparts

Objective: Assist and utilize members of M'GOSK Movement to build upon the success of our Order. ~ Create resources to be distributed to the M'GOSK network (and made available to all members online on the AZA and BBG Resources page):

- Marketing/Social Media "How-To Guide"
- Fundraising/Philanthropy "How-To Guide," made in cohesion with the Grand/Int'l Sh'lichim Committee, applicable for any chapter or region that wants to raise money for Stand UP, I\$F, and/or Scholarship
- Globalization "How-To Guide," made in cohesion with the Global Networking Committee
- Templates for letters to local synagogues, JCCs, etc. to ensure that chapters are able to send a uniform message to community partners
- Templates for taking minutes at regional, council, and chapter business meetings
- ...Eventually comprise all of these resources in a 2014-2015 MGOSK Handbook so that everything is easily accessible and in the same place
- ~ Form personal relationships with all 70+ regional/council counterparts through initial one-on-one video calls
- ~ Break girls into smaller groups based on common issues/goals; hold additional conference calls in these groups to target and work through mutual challenges
- ~ Establish connections with chapter counterparts at the beginning of their terms through introductory e-mails and provision of personal contact information
- ~ Host bi-monthly "exploration calls" open to chapter, regional, and council counterparts
 - Examples of call topics: enhancing the image of your chapter/region/council, how to engage your communities, and social media beyond Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram
- ~ Utilize the counterpart network as one way to bring international initiatives to the chapters

ILTC 2015

Objective: Inspire the current and future leaders of our Order through an experience that's as educational as it is enjoyable.

- ~ Personally contact every BBG attendee at least once before ILTC to learn what she is hoping to gain from the experience
- ~ Extensively review post-ILTC surveys in order to create an overall stronger program
- ~ Incorporate programming that stresses the applicability of skills learned at ILTC to the real world, beyond BBYO
- ~ Strive to create a K'Far BBG wherein each participant feels comfortable and accepted
- ~ Make every effort to abandon the notion that positions define success within ILTC and BBYO
- ~ Serve as an available resource and friend throughout the program
