
Recruitment

Inductions

Education

- ★ Each chapter will be required to hold MIT meetings once every two months
- * At B'yachad, as a group of Morim, come up with a writeup for each of the meetings to ensure program excellence
- > Have MIT/AIT specific programming at conventions - a convention can be intimidating to newer members. By having some programs separate from everyone else, they will get to meet other members their own age and form closer bonds earlier on.


