GOALS AND IDEAS

Community Service/Social Action

J-Serve Toronto: A community service event that changes every year. There are many different posts for which you can volunteer, a few examples include: cleaning an old synagogue in Downtown Toronto, assist at Habitat for Humanity, attend a DANI Canada Passover program, and many other programs. Our chapter would benefit from attending J-Serve as volunteers earn five volunteer hours towards a diploma. Being able to help out in the community is the act of Tikkun Olam.

Walk with Israel: A walk which educates both volunteers and walkers on various locations in Israel, and where the money raised is posted in various locations. Its main sponsor is the United Jewish Appeal (UJA), which is one of the large Jewish non-profit organization in Toronto.

Zareinu Moveathon: A walk/race in which children participate in. Zareinu is an organization that helps children with special needs. Alephs and Alephs in Training of Achim would enjoy getting to know and understand children that have special needs.

Social Action: If I'm elected as Shaliach, I would inform you about any Israeli based community events, for example, Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israel's birthday. I would also like our chapter to be involved in other social action events.

Jewish Programming

Stand Up Program: This program would teach our chapter about our stand-up cause (to be determined), and how beneficial it is to give tzedakah to the poor.
