GOALS AND IDEAS

CHAPTERS

- Publish chapter board reports 3 times a term with updated info on how the chapter is doing
- Chapter health evaluation at beginning and end of each term
- Give equal opportunities to all chapters (especially those not represented on r-board and those far away)
- Work with chapters to construct a specific plan for improvement
- Chapter leadership training program for all chapter members (not just board)
- Recognize each chapter for their uniqueness, help them develop and maintain a chapter identity
- Encourage chapter and regional leadership opportunities among members
- Ensure regional board liaisons are helping their assigned chapters
- Budgeting system to ensure financially stable chapters with quality programming

PROGRAMMING

- Have all chapter programs be approved by regional s'ganim
- Encourage original and inter-chapter programing
- Have regional programs every other month to bring the region closer together
- Clearly articulate use of the 6 folds in all program plans
- Revamp program template to be more user-friendly
- Acknowledge exceptional programming with awards and showcases at conventions
- · Encourage new friendships at all conventions, not just bro/sis
- Creative Shabbat electives at conventions (shorter programs)
- Give coordinators more opportunities to plan and lead at conventions
- Develop convention steering committees
- Bring back a GMR Formal
- Themed meals at conventions
- Establish a regional program database
