

- Contact local Synagogues and Temples for possible BBGs.
- Talk to chapter Mit Moms of full chapters in order to get names of girls
 that wanted to join that chapter and invite those girls to other chapter's
 events or regional events.
- Create a monthly membership goal for each individual chapter to ensure constant recruitment throughout the year.
- Make a BBYO logo to run in the Jewish News for promotion.
- Send flyers to 8th graders for upcoming regional events they can attend.
- · Call younger teens and talk to them about BBYO and what it is.
- Hold monthly Phone-a-Thons for members to call non-members and talk to them and invite them to events for chapter or region.
- Talk to parents about getting their teens involved in BBYO.
- · Have recruitment kick-offs to push on a regional level.
- · Have two membership kick-offs.
- Encourage members to bring Jewish teen friends to events and functions.
- · Have all year long recruitment.

Kick Offs: (Fall and Spring)

- Invite Teen Connection to attend kick-offs with BBYO.
- At regional kick-offs have everyone call one Jewish teen and invite them
 to the next event
- · Have two kick-offs, both to push regional membership.
- · Have an event for teens and then have one just for the parents.
- Invite all Jewish 8th graders to the kick-offs.
- Plan with AZAs.
- Have smaller chapters set up tables to show what their chapter is about.
- · Promote at local temples and synagogues.

Retention: (Staying active and involved)

- Plan senior getaway as an incentive for active seniors only.
- Talk to Mit Moms about working with the S'ganit to improve programming to increase attendance at programs.
- Encourage members to pay for all 4 year membership when joining, costs less and is worth it!
- Make BBG feelings to give out at council meetings and regional events.
- Make myself available to all BBG members.
- Motivate all BBGs to reach their full potential in this order.
- Help BBGs run for positions.
- Push chapters to not be just Regional convention chapters.
- Help chapter Mit Moms plan sisterhood programs, if they feel they have sisters they won't want to leave.
- Reach out to BBGs that have lost their spark and find ways to reignite their BBG flame.
- Create a regional program that deals with sisterhood and bonding.

Re-Education: (Learning What BBYO is all about)

- Hold a monthly dinner where any BBG can come to get educated and ask questions.
- At the beginning of the year have a Mit Mom education day besides operation counterparts,
- Have Mit Moms e-mail me a monthly education plan for educating their members.
- Attend chapter education programs to lend an extra hand if needed.
- Promote summer programs to younger members; they are a great way to learn leadership and all about BBYO.
- Help with the planning of YLC curriculum and weekend.
- Not just have education programs for Mits but for the entire chapter.
- Hand out a packet at operation counterparts that explain how to recruit and teach members.
- Have a contest between chapters that ends at regional convention, which
 ever chapter makes the best Mit book will win a prize. (Pizza Party, or
 Pool Party, or Ice Cream.)
- Encourage Mit Moms to create Mit boards.
- Have Menorah Pledge unwrapped program to explain the pledge and

New Chapters and Struggling Chapters:

- Work with girls in chapter to improve education.
- · Work with S'ganit on programming and sisterhood.
- Help chapter with recruitment of members.
- Keep in contact with the chapter.
- Work with chapter members or board.

Teen Connection:

- Work with Teen Connection to get 8th grades more excited about joining BBYO
- Have Teen Connection events with BBYO.
- Send flyers to 8th graders in Teen Connection inviting them to regional events
- · Work with the Teen Connection Chairwoman.
- Promote BBYO at Teen Connection to events and talk about what BBYO is.
- Invite Teen Connection to BBYO kick-offs.
- Get teens in Teen Connection more involved in BBYO
- Have Teen Connection come to events during regional convention to showcase chapters.
- Create a BBYO slideshow to show to teens at events.
- Attend all Teen Connection events.

Mit Moms: (Chapter Counterparts)

- Help Chapter Mit Moms contact non-members to invite them to chapter functions.
- Meet with each chapter Mit Mom once a month to ensure each chapter is recruiting and educating members.
- Meet at the beginning of the year to set out a plan for education and recruitment for each chapter individually.
- Make a how-to guide on what Mit Moms should do to educate members and recruit.
- Make a step-by-step paper telling teens how to sign up on b-linked.org.
- Mit Mom Lock-In to create a bond between Mit Moms in the region.
- Set chapter goals for each chapter.
- Work with each Mit Mom to create a Mit book.
- Send out Mit Mom Monthly e-mails to stay in touch and inform chapters about membership and education.
- Have a contest in the office to reach a regional BBG membership goal that
 the region can keep up with. If we reach the goal by the end of the year we
 can have a prize!
- Attend Mit events that each chapter plans.
- Educate Mit Moms at Operation counterparts.
- Have a mid-year evaluation with all Mit Moms
- Be available to them at any time needed.

Seniors:

- Senior Getaway for seniors that remain active their last year.
- Have chapters send letters to their seniors that graduated the previous year.
- Make senior apparel.
- Help chapter Mit Moms plan senior appreciation programs.
- Have chapter Mit Moms plan senior lives for seniors to tell their BBYO stories.

Big Sister/ Little Sister:

- Give each full-year regional board member a chapter to be their "big sister" and at regional council meetings will present their little sister chapter.
- Have the big sister be there to help with elections.
- Go to functions, give them a small present, and just be there for them.
- · Be in contact with N'siah and included in chapter e-mails.
- Get to know and help girls in little sister chapter.

YLC: (Young Leadership Conclave)

- Have regional alternative to YLC for AZAs/BBGs that could not go.
- Be involved in the education taught at YLC and the planning of the weekend along with the YLC coordinator.
