I want to make sure that all Alephs know enough to not only feel comfortable and included, but also able to share and contribute to discussions. In order to know about who we are as Jews, we need to know what we believe in and what makes us Jews.

### Understanding

As Jews and as Alephs, we have many traditions and most members know what they are and how to perform them. However, very few know why we do them. I aim to change that. I will encourage the chapter Shlichim to explain why we do what we do and teach them if they don't know. Simply saying "that's how we've always done it" is not good enough. I want Alephs to also understand the Hebrew prayers we say. Every week, I have lead Havdallah and I have always been bothered by the fact that very few knew why we did it and even fewer knew what we were saying. This isn't hard to fix and it will be one of the first things I will fix. It's as simple as having a short discussion at the end of a program, but it needs to be done.

### Havdallah

I want to make it very clear to Shlichim and their chapters that Havdallah is not optional. Not only should it be explained, it should be performed whenever possible on Saturday nights. I also want to make sure that every Shaliach has the supplies to correctly perform the Havdallah ceremony which has also been surprisingly lacking considering how easy, simple, and cheap it is to fix. I also want to make sure every chapter has a collection of kippot in order to correctly take part in Iewish traditions.
