- Call girls who attended MKOD and didn't join a chapter, encouraging them to consider Ruach BBG.
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{J}}$  Make a phone call or two to a new member after she joins, welcoming her into the chapter.
- Encourage chapter members to talk to friends about joining BBG.
- Call / e-mail / send a letter to inactive members, letting them know that Ruach misses them!
- Make re-registration as easy as possible by collecting membership fees quickly. This will make it easier to tell how many new members we will need to obtain during recruitment.
- Distribute driving lists to all MITs at the beginning of the year, letting them know that not having a ride shouldn't be a reason to not attend an event.
